Philosophy and Approach: It is my goal to assist people (especially those suffering) to attain the highest quality life style possible for them. I believe that all people have the right to the opportunity to achieve quality interdependent life styles. Many however lack this opportunity due to a number of difficulties (e.g. background training, educational skills and environmental issues). Further, I do not believe that most people need to develop a cognitive insight into their current difficulties to make significant improvements in their lives. My approach is thus specifically behavioral *skills training*. I rely almost entirely on (evidence based) ACT and DBT skills sets, although at times I may draw on specific *skills* approaches from other perspectives to meet the individual needs of the client.

Formal Education and Training: I hold a Master's Degree in Counseling in "Marriage and Family Therapy" (M.C., MFT) obtained at the University of Phoenix San Diego, CA campus. I have over 28 years of experience in the mental health field, working in the areas of crisis intervention, individual and group treatments (including the civil commitment process when needed), and in serving the developmentally disabled population.

Licensing: I am registered with the Oregon Board of Licensed Professional Counselors and Therapists as an LMFT intern (#R7034). I have completed the supervised hours for licensure and need only to take and pass the national examination, thus, I am no longer under clinical supervision.

Fees: My fees are as follows: For individual treatment the most anyone will pay is \$75 per hour. For group work the most anyone will pay is \$20 per session. Further, a generous sliding fee scale is available for those with low income. I will see anyone in need for as low as \$5 per session (group), \$25 (individual).

Client Bill of Rights: Per OAR 833-060-0004(h) my clients have the following rights.

- To expect that I have met at least the minimal qualifications of training and experience required by Oregon state law.
- To examine public records maintained by the Board and to have my credentials confirmed by the Board.

- To be assured of privacy and confidentiality while receiving services as defined by rule and law, including the following exceptions: 1) Reporting suspected child abuse; 2) Reporting imminent danger to client or others; 3) Reporting information required in court proceedings or by client's insurance company, or other relevant agencies; 4) Providing information concerning licensee case consultation or supervision; and 5) Defending claims brought by client against licensee.
